


Steps to Study Abroad at USC Upstate

1. Attend one of the regular general Info Sessions offered throughout the year. If you are unable to attend, schedule a first-time advising session with a study abroad advisor by calling 503-5630.
 2. Taking into consideration your motivation and goals for studying abroad, you can research programs based on your academic requirements, interests, budget, and timeline. Talking with a study abroad advisor and browsing in the study abroad resource library is a great place to start your search.
 3. Meet with a study abroad advisor to discuss both USC Upstate and Non-USC Upstate study abroad programs. Your study abroad advisor can answer questions you didn't even know you had!
 4. Meet with your academic advisor to discuss your academic requirements. After this meeting, you should be able to identify potential classes or subjects which you could take to meet degree requirements while abroad.
 5. After you have decided on a program, or have a few options in mind, review the costs, application deadlines, and other requirements with your study abroad advisor. All students who plan to study abroad must meet with an advisor prior to completing a USC Upstate or Non-USC Upstate application for study abroad.
 6. Congratulations! After you have been accepted, you will receive an acceptance letter and more information about your program. All students planning to study abroad are required to complete the Study Abroad Approval Form and return it to the Center for International Studies before leaving the U.S.
