

Criminal Justice Field Study: New York City

SCRJ 391 / May 8 – 16, 2009

In May 2009 the Criminal Justice Field Study will return to New York City. Students can receive 3 hours of Upper Level Criminal Justice Elective Credits for this course. The Field Study is designed to take the student out of the classroom and into the real world of criminal justice.

Preparations for the Field Study are still underway so it is too early to give exact details. However, previous Field Studies to New York have included meetings with ICE (Immigration, Customs Enforcement), the FBI, NYPD, NYC Dept of Corrections, the Center for Court Innovation, NYC Mayor's Office, The United Nations, The US Coast Guard, and correctional tours. Other activities include guided tours of New York City, walking tours of the East and West Villages, Central Park, and a boat tour around the Island of Manhattan.

Optional activities (not included in the cost of the trip) are going to a Broadway Play, a major league baseball game (Yankees or Mets), and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Students will also have free time to explore the city on their own.

Because of the uncertainty of airfare, etc, the pricing of the trip at this time is only an estimate. ***The estimated cost of the trip is \$1450.*** This price includes roundtrip airfare, 8 nights lodging at a hotel, transportation to and from the New York Airport (Laguardia), admission to the United Nations, admission to the Teddy Roosevelt Birthplace, a Grayline Tour (double-decker tour bus) of lower Manhattan, a boat tour around Manhattan Island, and any other group activity that cost money. Students must also enroll in the course and pay tuition.
