Our partners at Spartanburg Regional Hospital announced yesterday afternoon that they will provide a walk-in Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine clinic for USC Upstate students, faculty and staff today! The vaccine being given, Pfizer, is the most administered vaccine in America, with over 37 million Americans fully vaccinated by it.

COVID-19 Vaccine Walk-In Clinic, Thursday, April 15

- **Vaccine Brand:** Pfizer (Age 16 and up, egg-free and latex-free)
- **Location:** URC (University Readiness Center, 301 N. Campus Blvd, Spartanburg)
- **Time:** 9 a.m. – 7:30 p.m., open continuously
- No pre-registration or appointment needed, free, only photo ID needed
- Dose 1 given today, Dose 2 will be due the week after finals week (flexible days and locations, can be given any day that week 17-24 days after dose 1, anywhere in the United States)

If you have not started your vaccine series for COVID-19, I encourage you to start today. Once fully vaccinated, you protect your health, your family and community, and you do not have to quarantine if exposed for the time period set by public health officials. Enjoy your summer free of worry from changed plans, and the personal, financial, and academic disruption of COVID-19 illness and quarantine.

Make an educated choice for yourself, and review more information about the vaccines from the [CDC](https://www.cdc.gov). Also, Dr. Jane Kelly from DHEC gave an informative virtual presentation for campus about COVID-19 vaccinations on March 4, viewable [here](#).
