- Before you return to campus in the fall, and as soon as possible, please upload proof of COVID-19 vaccination, after all doses have been completed, to www.uscupstate.edu/myhealth.
- At this time, we strongly encourage all students to get vaccinated against COVID-19.
- For those who are unvaccinated, mandatory re-entry testing and periodic random testing will be required fall semester.
- Through the summer and beyond, if you are unvaccinated and exposed, it will result in quarantine, potential COVID-19 illness, and possible medical, academic, financial and social disruptions.


